GPA = 4 Years SAT = 4 Hours Colleges look at both the same!

Most students spend four years worrying about one half of the numerical components that determine their acceptance to college, and wait a few weeks before their SAT or ACT test to worry about the other half. College admissions tests are not something to think about as a junior, you need to think about it NOW!





Preparing for the SAT/ACT should be a 4-year process, not a 3-month one!

The traditional model for success has been maintaining a strong GPA throughout your high school career, while being active in your school and community; however, most students fail to realize that colleges critically look at your college admissions (SAT and/or ACT) test scores. The first step toward your child's success is to take the **PSAT** on **October 17**th. Yes, you should take the PSAT as a freshman!
