

**Seminole County Public Schools
And
Lyman High School
Student Dress Code**

General Information:

Responsibility for the dress and appearance of students enrolled in Seminole County Public Schools primarily rests with parents and the students. Some student apparel, however, may not be appropriate to wear to school

The School Board has established the following minimal guidelines:

- Standards of appearance shall insure that the students be clean, neat, and properly dressed.
- Students should dress appropriately to be successful in the academic environment.
- It is the responsibility of the Principal to see that the dress appearance of any students shall not be extreme, create a disturbance or is not hazardous to oneself, others or school property.
- The Principal or his/her designee has the final authority for interpreting whether a student's apparel/appearance conforms to the dress code.

The following information is proposed to help clarify the Seminole County Public

Head: No caps, visors, hoods, bandanas, sunglasses or other head gear may be worn on campus except with administrative permission.

Upper Garments: All garments must have a collar or sleeves. Prohibited: halter tops, tube tops, backless dresses/tops, spaghetti straps and tank tops. Shirts must touch, at a minimum the top portion of lower garments at all times.

Lower Garments: Undergarments and the buttocks **MUST** remain entirely covered even while seated.

Dresses, skirts and shorts must be at least mid-thigh or below in length. Rips/tears above mid-thigh are not permitted
